Elizabethtown Borough Mayor Appointed to Public Policy Board

In his community, Mummert has served as President and Assistant District Governor of the Elizabethtown Rotary Club and he volunteers by singing the Canadian and American National Anthems at professional baseball, hockey and football games as well as at nursing homes and churches.
